Court Hierarchy and Jurisdiction - WA

The High Court

- Original: Handles constitutional matters, state conflicts, and disputes between Commonwealth and state/territory laws.
- Appellate: Hears appeals from state, territory, and federal courts on issues involving federal law.
- All decisions are final and binding on all lower courts throughout Australia.

Family Court

- State and Federal jurisdiction in matters of family law.
- Handles cases related to divorce, marital or de facto property disputes, child-related matters, and adoptions.

Children's Court

- All criminal matters for children aged between 10 and 18.
- Care & protection matters and restraining order applications relating to children under 18.

Magistrates Court

- Criminal: Simple offences e.g., traffic offence and some 'either way' offences.
- Civil: Matters involving claims up to \$75,000.
- There are no juries in these courts.

The Drug Court

- Restricted to drugrelated offenders.
- Focuses on assisting people whose offending is a result of substance misuse.

 Helps intellectually disabled people in the criminal justice system.

Warden's Court

• Hears disputes over mining tenements (legal permits or licenses to mine) in Western Australia.

Coroner's Court

• Investigates unnatural, unexpected, sudden and suspicious deaths.
